MALAYSIA TO SHOWCASE CONSTRUCTION EXCELLENCE AND DIGITAL INNOVATION IN WORLD EXPO 2025 OSAKA, KANSAI

OSAKA, JAPAN, 8 JULY 2025 – Malaysia is set to take the global stage at the World Expo 2025 Osaka with the hosting of Malaysia Construction Week 2025 from 7 to 13 July 2025 at the Malaysia Pavilion, Yumeshima, Osaka. This flagship initiative is jointly organised by the Ministry of Works Malaysia (KKR) and the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) Malaysia under the coordination of the Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry (MITI).

Held under the theme “**Digitally: Innovate. Infuse, Construct**”, Malaysia Construction Week 2025 highlights the country’s leadership in digital transformation, sustainable construction and global industry collaboration. The event is part of Malaysia’s broader participation at the Expo themed “**Designing Future Society for Our Lives**”, with the Malaysia Pavilion carrying the national theme “**Weaving a Future in Harmony**”. This is an opportunity to position Malaysia as a key player in the future of construction, driven by innovation, digitalisation and sustainability.

The week-long programme will feature a series of strategic engagement including opening ceremony and opening seminar by KKR and CIDB, business networking cocktail and Malaysia-Japan construction networking dinner, memorandum of collaboration signing ceremony, Malaysian Highway seminar and seminar on Malaysian professionals, expert talks at the outdoor main stage and business matching sessions with Japanese stakeholders.

Under the industry showcase and innovation at the Malaysia Pavilion, visitors will experience first-hand the latest in Malaysian construction technology through I-Supervision site monitoring system and Smart road safety speed sign sensor by Public Works Department (JKR), building model showcase by Veritas, video highlights of major infrastructure projects from Setiawangsa-Pantai Expressway (SPE), Sungai Besi-Ulu Kelang Expressway SUKE, PLUS Malaysia Berhad and IJM Construction. Live product demonstrations by 21 participating Malaysian companies under the CIDB delegation.

This event is co-hosted by leading Malaysian agencies such as Public Works Department (JKR), Malaysia Highway Authority (LLM), Board of Engineers Malaysia (BEM), Board of Quantity Surveyors Malaysia (BQSM) and Board of Architects Malaysia (BAM). Participating companies include major names such as IJM Construction, PLUS Malaysia Berhad, AECOM Perunding, Grab (M) Sdn. Bhd. and various firms in architecture, engineering, quantity surveying and smart technology solutions.

During this expo Akademi Binaan Malaysia (ABM) Sarawak and Kumiai Japan will ink a memorandum of collaboration (MOC) in building capacity and transferring knowledge and technology advancement of Malaysia construction industry.

Targeted for international developers, Japanese construction stakeholders, policy-makers and industry professionals, each of the programme aims to foster cross-border partnerships, promote investment and position Malaysia as a hub for smart and sustainable construction in the region.
