

# Dialogue Session between UNFCCC COP30 Presidency and ASEAN Environment Ministers during the 18<sup>th</sup> ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on the Environment (AMME-18)

### **BACKGROUND**

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) represents one of the world's most climate-vulnerable regions, with member states facing increasing threats from sea-level rise, extreme weather events and shifting precipitation patterns. As the global community prepares for the 30th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC COP30) in 2025, ASEAN's collective voice and coordinated climate action become increasingly critical.

Under Malaysia's leadership as both ASEAN Chair 2025 and Chair of the ASEAN Working Group on Climate Change (AWGCC), there is a strategic opportunity to strengthen the partnership between ASEAN and the UNFCCC COP30 Presidency. This initiative aligns with ASEAN's commitment to enhanced climate cooperation and its role as a constructive partner in multilateral climate negotiations.

The proposed dialogue session with H.E. Ambassador André Aranha Corrêa do Lago, who serves as the UNFCCC COP30 President represents a pivotal moment to advance ASEAN's climate priorities and ensure regional perspectives are effectively integrated into the global climate agenda.

### **PURPOSE AND BENEFITS OF THE DIALOGUE SESSION**

#### **Strategic Alignment**

The dialogue addresses several critical imperatives:

- **Regional Coordination:** ASEAN Member States (AMS) require enhanced coordination mechanisms to present unified positions on key climate issues such as adaptation, loss and damage, climate financing, carbon market and just transition pathways. Direct engagement with the UNFCCC COP30 Presidency provides an avenue for articulating these collective priorities.
- **Capacity Building:** The session offers opportunities for knowledge transfer and technical cooperation particularly in areas where AMS can benefit from Brazil's experience in climate policy, forest conservation and renewable energy development.
- **Enhanced Negotiating Position:** By engaging directly with the UNFCCC COP30 Presidency, ASEAN can better understand negotiation dynamics and strategic priorities, enabling more effective participation in multilateral climate discussions.

## **Anticipated Benefits**

For ASEAN:

- Strengthened collective bargaining position in international climate negotiations.
- Improved understanding of the UNFCCC COP30 priorities and negotiation strategies.
- Opportunities for South-South cooperation and knowledge sharing.

For the UNFCCC COP30 Presidency:

- Better understanding of Southeast Asian climate vulnerabilities and priorities.
- Enhanced support for the UNFCCC COP30 objectives through ASEAN's diplomatic networks.
- Strengthened foundations for ambitious climate outcomes.
