50 NEA 2026 WINNERS ADVANCE MALAYSIA'S SUSTAINABLE ENERGY ASPIRATIONS

PUTRAJAYA, 12 August 2026 – The Ministry of Energy Transition and Water Transformation (PETRA) recognised 50 outstanding organisations at the National Energy Awards (NEA) 2026 held yesterday in Kuala Lumpur, for their achievements in advancing sustainable energy development through renewable energy deployment and energy efficiency practices.

The NEA 2026 winners were selected across four (4) categories:

1. Energy Management
2. Energy Efficient Building
3. Renewable Energy
4. Special Awards

The winners demonstrate the growing commitment of organisations across various sectors to advancing Malaysia's energy transition through practical and innovative solutions. Collectively, the winning projects delivered 270.54 GWh in annual energy savings and renewable energy generation, RM48.82 million in annual energy cost savings, and an estimated annual reduction of 9.93 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions, equivalent to removing approximately 2.2 million cars from Malaysia's roads. These achievements contribute to Malaysia's aspiration to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas emissions as early as 2050.

NEA 2026 also marks a significant milestone, with the Renewable Energy category receiving a full slate of submissions for the first time. This reflects

the growing diversity and maturity of Malaysia's renewable energy ecosystem, as organisations increasingly deploy clean energy solutions such as solar photovoltaic systems, battery energy storage systems (BESS), biogas, waste-to-energy and green hydrogen to strengthen energy resilience and accelerate the nation's energy transition.

The achievements of the NEA 2026 winners support the implementation of the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR) and the PETRA Strategic Plan 2026–2030, which prioritise renewable energy deployment, energy efficiency, energy security and the development of a competitive, low-carbon economy. They also underscore that Malaysia's energy transition is a shared national mission requiring the collective commitment of the Government, industry, businesses and communities to build a resilient, sustainable and inclusive energy future.

Selected NEA 2026 winners will represent Malaysia at the ASEAN Energy Awards (AEA), showcasing the country's sustainable energy achievements and best practices at the regional level. This reinforces NEA's role as the national platform for identifying and recognising exemplary organisations with the potential to excel at both national and ASEAN levels.

NEA 2026 is also the first edition with the Sustainable Energy Development Authority (SEDA) Malaysia serving as the Secretariat, following the transition from the Malaysian Green Technology and Climate Change Corporation (MGTC). PETRA is confident that SEDA Malaysia will further strengthen NEA as a platform for recognising excellence, broadening industry participation and supporting Malaysia's renewable energy and energy efficiency agenda.

PETRA congratulates all NEA 2026 winners for demonstrating the impact that can be achieved when innovation, practical solutions and commitment are aligned with national priorities. PETRA encourages more organisations across Malaysia to invest in sustainable energy practices and participate in future editions of NEA in support of the nation's energy transition agenda.
