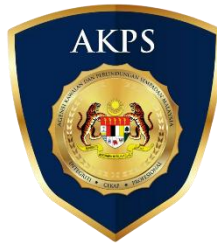

PEGAWAI PENGUATKUASA DITAHAN DI KOMPLEKS KASTAM, IMIGRESEN DAN KUARANTIN (CIQ) BANGUNAN SULTAN ISKANDAR (BSI) DISYAKI TERLIBAT KEGIATAN "FLYING PASSPORT"

JOHOR BAHRU, 26 Julai 2025 – 2 orang pegawai penguatkuasa telah ditahan di Kompleks CIQ Bangunan Sultan Iskandar pada malam 25 Julai 2025 kerana disyaki terlibat dalam kegiatan salah laku "Flying Passport" selepas satu pemantauan yang bermula pada jam 3.00 petang telah dijalankan terhadap kumpulan yang bertugas.

Penahanan dibuat pada kira-kira jam 7.30 malam oleh pasukan Unit Pematuhan AKPS BSI setelah mengesan beberapa kemasukan data pelawat yang meragukan melalui ID pengguna seorang pegawai yang bertugas di kaunter zon kereta. Unit Pematuhan AKPS BSI turut mengesan data pelawat asing yang berada dalam kategori pelawat bermasalah yang memerlukan tindakan pembetulan ralat oleh penyelia bertugas.

Pada jam 9.00 malam pula, Unit Pematuhan AKPS BSI telah mengesan tindakan pelepasan ralat terhadap data pelawat bermasalah yang telah dilakukan melalui ID seorang penyelia yang bertugas di zon motosikal.

Hasil tindakan pemeriksaan yang telah dijalankan di kaunter kereta telah menemukan wang tunai berjumlah RM 2,800.00 serta dua (2) unit telefon bimbit dalam simpanan pegawai. Soal-siasat yang dijalankan telah berjaya membawa kepada penemuan sejumlah 11 naskah pasport warganegara People's Republic of China (PRC) dan tiga (3) naskah pasport warganegara Indonesia dalam sebuah beg berwarna hitam yang disembunyikan di atas siling kaunter berlainan.

Unit Pematuhan AKPS BSI turut membuat pemeriksaan di kaunter penyelia zon motosikal di mana terdapat seorang penyelia yang sedang bertugas dan hasil pemeriksaan telah menemukan dua (2) unit telefon bimbit yang seterusnya dirampas untuk siasatan lanjut.

Kedua-dua pegawai tersebut telah ditahan oleh Unit Pematuhan AKPS BSI dan diserahkan kepada SPRM negeri Johor untuk tindakan lanjut. Kes juga telah dilaporkan kepada Ketua Unit Integriti AKPS Putrajaya.

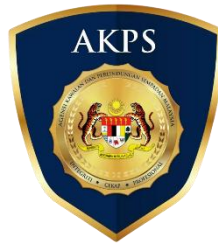

ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS DETAINED AT CUSTOMS, IMMIGRATION AND QUARANTINE (CIQ) COMPLEX, SULTAN ISKANDAR BUILDING (BSI), SUSPECTED OF INVOLVEMENT IN “FLYING PASSPORT” ACTIVITIES

JOHOR BAHRU, 26 July 2025 – Two enforcement officers were detained at the CIQ Complex, Sultan Iskandar Building, on the night of 25 July 2025, suspected of involvement in misconduct related to the “Flying Passport” activity. The arrests followed a surveillance operation that began at 3:00 PM on the same day targeting the team on duty.

The arrests were made at approximately 7:30 PM by the BSI AKPS Compliance Unit after detecting several suspicious visitor data entries using the user ID of an officer stationed at the vehicle zone counter. The Compliance Unit also identified data entries involving foreign visitors classified as problematic visitors, which required data error correction action by the supervising officer on duty.

At around 9:00 PM, the BSI AKPS Compliance Unit detected a data error clearance action involving a problematic visitor entry, carried out using the ID of a supervisor stationed in the motorcycle zone.

A search at the vehicle zone counter led to the discovery of RM 2,800 in cash and two (2) mobile phones in the officer’s possession. Further questioning led to the discovery of eleven (11) passports belonging to nationals of the People’s Republic of China (PRC) and three (3) passports belonging to Indonesian nationals. These documents were hidden inside a black bag concealed above the ceiling of a different counter.

The BSI AKPS Compliance Unit also conducted an inspection at the motorcycle zone supervisor counter, where an on-duty supervisor was present. The inspection resulted in the discovery of two (2) mobile phones, which were subsequently seized for further investigation.

Both officers were detained by the BSI AKPS Compliance Unit and handed over to the Johor State Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) for further action. The case was also reported to the Head of the Integrity Unit, AKPS Putrajaya.
