**MALAYSIA ANJUR PERSIDANGAN JURUAUDIT ASEAN 2025
BUAT JULUNG KALI**

PUTRAJAYA, 27 Mei 2025 – Selaras dengan Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 dan pelantikan Ketua Audit Negara Malaysia sebagai Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Audit ASEAN, Jabatan Audit Negara (JAN) menganjurkan Persidangan Juruaudit ASEAN 2025 buat julung kalinya pada 27–28 Mei 2025 di Pusat Konvensyen Antarabangsa Putrajaya (PICC). Persidangan ini menghimpunkan 2,243 orang peserta daripada sektor awam dan swasta serta menyaksikan penyertaan peserta negara serantau dan antarabangsa dengan kehadiran beberapa Ketua Institusi Audit Tertinggi (*Supreme Audit Institution* – SAI) negara ASEAN dan Asia termasuk SAI Brunei, SAI Filipina, SAI Kemboja, SAI Lao PDR, SAI Maldives dan SAI Yaman.

Majlis perasmian disempurnakan oleh YBhg. Tan Sri Shamsul Azri bin Abu Bakar, Ketua Setiausaha Negara. Ucapan perasmian beliau yang dibacakan oleh YBhg. Dato' Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi, Ketua Audit Negara menyeru kerjasama serantau dalam memperkukuh tatakelola dan integriti, memanfaatkan teknologi serta meningkatkan kedudukan ASEAN dalam Indeks Persepsi Rasuah (CPI). Beliau turut menekankan peranan penting Institusi Audit Tertinggi (SAI) dalam memperkukuh daya tahan ekonomi dan memastikan pelaksanaan reformasi yang berkesan.

Bertemakan "*Inclusive and Sustainable Auditing for a Progressive ASEAN*", persidangan ini menjadi medan strategik untuk berkongsi pengetahuan dan pengalaman bagi memperkukuhkan rangka kerja audit selaras dengan cabaran masa

kini yang merangkumi transformasi digital dalam pengauditan, penyesuaian kepada keperluan pelaporan Alam Sekitar, Sosial dan Tatakelola (ESG), pembangunan kapasiti serta jalinan kerjasama merentas sempadan negara.

Persidangan ini turut menampilkan H.E. Dr. Kao Kim Hourn, Setiausaha Agung ASEAN yang telah menyampaikan ucap tama melalui rakaman video. Dalam ucapannya, beliau mengiktiraf kebolehpercayaan peranan juruaudit dalam sektor awam, swasta dan audit dalaman selain menyeru kerjasama serantau dan rentas sektor untuk membina profesion audit yang berwibawa dan dipercayai.

Satu daripada program utama Persidangan adalah Sesi Dialog Tertinggi dengan topik perbincangan, Meningkatkan Pengauditan Sektor Awam Melalui Sususlan Audit (*Enhancing Public Sector Auditing Through Follow-up Audit*) yang melibatkan ahli panel terdiri daripada YBhg. Dato' Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi, Ketua Audit Negara Malaysia; H.E. Mr. Gamaliel Asis Cordoba, Pengerusi Suruhanjaya Audit, Filipina dan YBrs. Encik Pranoto, Ketua Pengarah VII, Badan Pemeriksa Keuangan Republik Indonesia. Fokus perbincangan adalah perkongsian pengalaman negara masing-masing dalam melaksanakan susulan audit dan kepentingan susulan audit sebagai satu inisiatif dalam memacu reformasi dasar dan meningkatkan kepercayaan awam.

**MALAYSIA HOSTS THE INAUGURAL ASEAN AUDITORS
CONFERENCE 2025**

PUTRAJAYA, 27 May 2025 – In line with Malaysia's ASEAN Chairmanship in 2025 and the appointment of the Auditor General of Malaysia as Chair of the ASEAN Audit Committee (AAC), the National Audit Department of Malaysia (NADM) hosted the inaugural ASEAN Auditor Conference 2025 on 27–28 May 2025 at the Putrajaya International Convention Centre (PICC), Putrajaya. This conference gathers 2,243 participants from both the public and private sectors, and welcomes regional and international attendees, including several Heads of Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs) from ASEAN and Asia such as SAI Brunei, SAI Philippines, SAI Cambodia, SAI Lao PDR, SAI Maldives, and SAI Yemen.

The opening ceremony was officiated by YBhg. Tan Sri Shamsul Azri bin Abu Bakar, Chief Secretary to the Government. His keynote address, delivered by YBhg. Dato' Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi, Auditor General of Malaysia, called for enhanced regional cooperation to strengthen governance and integrity, leverage technology, and elevate ASEAN's position in the Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI). She also emphasised the crucial role of Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs) in enhancing economic resilience and ensuring the effective implementation of reforms.

Under the theme "Inclusive and Sustainable Auditing for a Progressive ASEAN", the conference serves as a strategic platform for sharing knowledge and experiences to strengthen audit frameworks in line with current challenges. These include digital transformation in auditing, adaptation to Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) reporting requirements, capacity building, and cross-border collaboration.

The conference also featured a keynote address by H.E. Dr. Kao Kim Hourn, Secretary-General of ASEAN, delivered via video message. In his remarks, he affirmed the credibility and essential role of auditors in the public, private, and internal audit sectors, while urging greater regional and cross-sector collaboration to develop a trusted and capable audit profession.

One of the main highlights of the conference was the High-Level Dialogue Session discussing the topic “Enhancing Public Sector Auditing Through Follow-up Audit”, featuring panelists YBhg. Dato’ Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi, Auditor General of Malaysia; H.E. Mr. Gamaliel Asis Cordoba, Chairman of the Commission on Audit, Philippines; and YBrs. Encik Pranoto, Director General VII of the Audit Board of the Republic of Indonesia. The session focused on sharing national experiences in conducting follow-up audits and the importance of such audits as an initiative to drive policy reform and strengthen public trust.

The ASEAN Auditor Conference 2025 is supported by various strategic partners, including professional bodies and global audit firms such as the Malaysian Institute of Accountants (MIA), Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), Malaysian Institute of Certified Public Accountants (MICPA), Institute of Internal Auditors Malaysia (IIAM), as well as Deloitte, Ernst & Young (EY), Klynveld Peat Marwick Goerdeler (KPMG), and PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC).

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
