

PELAJAR POLISAS RAIH KEJAYAAN DI CHINA-ASEAN “FUTURE ARCHITECT” SUMMER CAMP

KUANTAN – “Program ini adalah platform terbaik yang menghimpunkan pelajar-pelajar bidang seni bina untuk bertukar-tukar pandangan serta mempelajari keindahan senibina dan kebudayaan China”, demikian ucapan perkongsian Siti Khadijah Nur Syahadah Mohd Farid, 20, pelajar semester empat program Diploma Seni Bina, Politeknik Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah (POLISAS) yang berjaya meraih tempat kedua dalam *International Youth Talk* sempena China-ASEAN “Future Architect” Summer Camp, baru-baru ini.

Program ini merupakan antara pengisian 2025 China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week (CAECW 2025) yang berlangsung di Guiyang, China bermula pada 22 sehingga 28 Julai 2025. Program ini merupakan anjuran bersama Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Regional Center for Technical Education Development (SEAMEO TED) dan Guizhou Polytechnic of Construction, China, dengan kerjasama Go Study Global Education (Go-Study).

China-ASEAN “Future Architect” Summer Camp ini menghimpunkan 21 pelajar dari negara-negara ASEAN termasuk Malaysia, Kemboja, Indonesia, Vietnam, Thailand, Myanmar, Brunei, Filipina dan Laos bagi meneroka keindahan seni bina China serta memupuk pemahaman rentas budaya.

Sepanjang kem ini berlangsung, para pelajar telah dibawa melawat mercu tanda terkenal seperti Bandar Purba Qingyan, sambil menghayati keindahan alam semula jadi dan suasana bersejarah di Guiyang.

Selain itu, mereka juga berpeluang meneroka gaya seni bina etnik serta teknologi bangunan hijau terkini melalui lawatan ke pusat latihan vokasional, syarikat pembinaan dan muzium tempatan.

Kemuncak aktiviti kem ini ialah *International Youth Roundtable Meeting*, di mana para peserta berpeluang berdiskusi secara mendalam mengenai isu-isu penting seperti kelestarian, pemeliharaan warisan budaya, serta peranan belia dalam mencorak masa depan seni bina inovatif.

Penyertaan dalam program antarabangsa ini bukan sahaja membuka minda pelajar kepada perspektif global, malah memperkayakan pengetahuan akademik dan budaya mereka.

Pengalaman ini juga turut membina jalinan persahabatan serantau yang bakal menjadi aset penting dalam perkembangan peribadi dan kerjaya mereka dalam bidang seni bina khususnya.

Sempena CAECW 2025 ini juga, Timbalan Pengarah (Akademik) POLISAS, Hajah Wan Zuraida Wan Yusoff turut diberikan peluang sebagai *Keynote Speaker* di Persidangan *Jointly Building a New Ecosystem for China-ASEAN Vocational Education Development* yang berlangsung pada 27 Julai 2025.

POLISAS STUDENT SHINES AT CHINA-ASEAN “FUTURE ARCHITECT” SUMMER CAMP

KUANTAN – “This programme served as a great platform for architecture students to exchange perspectives and experience the beauty of Chinese architecture and culture,” said Siti Khadijah Nur Syahadah Mohd Farid, 20, a fourth-semester Diploma in Architecture student at Politeknik Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah (POLISAS), who secured Second Place in the International Youth Talk during the China-ASEAN “Future Architect” Summer Camp held recently.

The programme was one of the highlights of the 2025 China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week (CAECW 2025) held in Guiyang, China, from 22 to 28 July 2025. It was jointly organised by the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Regional Center for Technical Education Development (SEAMEO TED) and Guizhou Polytechnic of Construction, China, with support from Go Study Global Education (Go-Study).

The China-ASEAN “Future Architect” Summer Camp brought together 21 students from ASEAN countries including Malaysia, Cambodia, Indonesia, Vietnam, Thailand, Myanmar, Brunei, the Philippines, and Laos, to explore Chinese architectural heritage and foster intercultural understanding.

Throughout the camp, participants visited renowned landmarks such as Qingyan Ancient Town, where they immersed themselves in Guiyang’s natural landscapes and historical ambiance. They also had the opportunity to explore ethnic architectural styles and cutting-edge green building technologies through visits to vocational training centres, construction companies, and local museums.

A key highlight of the camp was the International Youth Roundtable Meeting, where participants engaged in discussions on key issues such as sustainability, cultural heritage preservation, and the role of youth in shaping the future of architectural innovation.

Participation in this international programme not only broadened the students’ global perspectives, but also enriched their academic and cultural knowledge. The experience also forged strong regional friendships that will serve as a valuable

foundation for their personal and professional growth, especially in the field of architecture.

In conjunction with CAECW 2025, Deputy Director (Academic) of POLISAS, Hajah Wan Zuraida Wan Yusoff, was also invited to deliver a keynote address at the Conference on Jointly Building a New Ecosystem for China-ASEAN Vocational Education Development, held on 27 July 2025.
